

Anderson Survives 50T To Top A&M Consolidated



In what may be Anderson's biggest regular-season win in two decades, the Trojans edged No. 8 A&M Consolidated 42-40 in a five-overtime classic Friday night at Tigerland Stadium.

Running back Caleb Crenshaw powered the offense with 206 yards and three touchdowns, while quarterback Cove Darbyshire added a rushing score. Anderson went a perfect 4-for-4 on two-point tries in overtime, including the decisive conversion in the fifth extra frame. The defense sealed it when Datrien Campbell, Max Middleton, Pierce Miller, and Yaheim Riley stopped the Tigers' quarterback short of the goal line.

The game was tied 21-21 at the end of regulation. Along the way, Liam McMillan blocked a punt to set up a score, and linebacker Hodges Smith made several key plays. Anderson finished with 319 rushing yards, with Jay Fullmer adding 103 total yards.

With the victory, Anderson improved to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in District 12-5A Division I, standing as the district's last unbeaten team heading into Week 6.

Bentley led the Bobcats to a dominant 55–21 victory over Kilgore in the Class 4AD1 state championship last December. He was named Offensive MVP after throwing for 265 yards and five touchdowns on 4/9 passing. The title gave Celina their ninth in program history and first since 2007, tying them with Katy and Richland Springs for third-most all-time in UIL history.

Listed at 6'2, Bentley is a 4-star prospect according to 247Sports. He's ranked as the No. 7 quarterback nationally in the 2026 class, No. 12 overall in Texas, and No. 78 overall in the country.

Bentley's junior campaign was nothing short of electric. He completed 171 of 245 passes for 3,211 yards and 47 touchdowns while adding 923 rushing yards and 16 more scores on the ground. He earned first-team All-Area honors from GM Sports Media and capped off his season by appearing in the All-American Bowl in January.

He becomes the 10th commitment in Oklahoma's 2026 recruiting class, joining Midlothian offensive lineman Noah Best and Frisco Lone Star linebacker Ryder Mix—both of whom announced their pledges earlier this June.

Aledo Bearcats, with over the record of 12 state championships in football, from the years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2022 and 2023, have set an even more impressive record of 132 district games winning streak. Their 34-14 win over Alvarado on October 14, 2007 started it and now 18 years later they have gone without a single district lose since.

Rockwall ends 19 game home winning Streak for #1 North Crowley



Rockwall pulled off one of the biggest upsets of the young season Thursday night, knocking off defending Class 6A Division I state champion North Crowley, 37-35, at Crowley ISD Multi Purpose Stadium. The Yellowjackets trailed for most of the night but stormed back in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Brent Rickert delivered the deciding blow, connecting on a 20-yard touchdown with just 22 seconds left to secure the win.

The loss snapped North Crowley's 19-game winning streak and marked its first regular-season defeat since 2021. Head coach Ray Gates now sits at 45-3 during his time with the Panthers.

Rockwall (2-2) scored three times in the final period, showcasing its resilience. Rickert powered in a 6-yard touchdown run late in the quarter and followed it up by converting a two-point attempt despite taking a heavy hit. That gave Rockwall a 31-28 edge with just under four minutes to go. North Crowley (3-1) answered quickly behind running back G'yrell Smith, who sprinted 37 yards for his fifth touchdown of the night, reclaiming a 35-31 lead with less than two minutes remaining.

Needing another big moment, Rockwall turned to its ground game. On a critical fourth-and-1, running back Kaydon Castro pushed the chains with a three-yard pickup. That set the stage for Rickert's winning strike downfield moments later.

Rickert finished the night with 292 passing yards, two touchdown throws, and a rushing score. Castro added 71 rushing yards and three touchdowns, giving him five on the season

Despite the loss, North Crowley showcased why it remains one of the most dangerous rushing teams in the state. The Panthers piled up 342 rushing yards, all five touchdowns coming from Smith. He totaled 191 yards on 22 carries, scoring from distances of 37, 12, 24, 19, and 6 yards.

Running back Kiante Ingram added 124 yards on 20 attempts, while standout offensive tackle John Turntine III anchored the line. But the passing game never found a rhythm. Quarterback Demarcus Harris was held to just 38 passing yards and one interception. Four-star wide receiver Damarion Mays, who exploded for 188 yards the week before, was limited to only one catch for six yards.

Bo Odgen Commits to University of Texas



Westlake senior forward Bo Ogden will suit up for the Texas Longhorns next season, carrying on his family's tradition in burnt orange. Ogden revealed his college choice Tuesday afternoon inside the Westlake High School gym, surrounded by family, coaches, and classmates.

The 6-foot-6 wing is ranked among the nation's top 40 prospects and is considered one of the top 10 players in Texas. After fielding interest from programs such as Purdue, Virginia, Gonzaga, Kansas, and Tennessee, he ultimately narrowed his focus to Texas and Tennessee before picking the Longhorns.

The decision keeps Ogden close to home while also tying him to his father's legacy. Chris Ogden, now on staff at Texas, captained the 2003 Longhorns team that advanced to the NCAA Final Four under Rick Barnes. His coaching career has taken him through stops at Tennessee, Texas Tech, and UT-Arlington before rejoining Texas in 2021. On Tuesday, Chris sat with his wife Katie, daughter Ellie, and youngest son Parker as Bo announced his decision. The scene highlighted a family deeply connected to Texas basketball.

Ogden has been a standout throughout his high school years. Last season, while at St. Michael's, he hit a buzzer-beater to clinch the TAPPS Class 6A state title over Dallas Parish Episcopal. He later transferred to Westlake, where his senior year is already drawing attention.

A four-star recruit by 247Sports, he was named the American-Statesman's Central Texas private school player of the year in 2024. Known for his size, versatility, and scoring ability, Ogden is expected to be an immediate impact player at the next level.

Under new head coach Sean Miller, Texas is focused on building around elite recruits with program ties, and Ogden fits that perfectly — a nationally ranked prospect with family roots in Austin. For now, the spotlight is his, as he prepares to take his game to the Longhorns' biggest stage.



The Lake Travis Cavaliers shook off a sluggish start Thursday night with a blistering second-quarter surge, overwhelming the Bowie Bulldogs 63-21 in the District 26-6A opener.

Bowie couldn't have scripted a better beginning. Against Central Texas' top-ranked Class 6A squad, the Bulldogs struck first with touchdowns on their opening two drives for a stunning 14-0 lead. Rhys Moreno capped one drive with a rushing score, while Trevor Watts hauled in a trick-play pass from receiver Kieron Campbell for the other. Meanwhile, the Cavs' offense sputtered with back-to-back punts.

By the end of the first quarter, Bowie led 14-0 and held a 125-2 advantage in total yards.

Then everything flipped.

"We just weren't locked in," Lake Travis defensive end Carter Buck admitted. "We came in here thinking we were going to steamroll them, which we eventually did, but early on we weren't sharp. Credit to (Moreno). We had three guys chasing him and still couldn't bring him down. But once we figured it out, we were fine."

The Cavaliers (5-0, 1-0) responded with an avalanche, outscoring Bowie 42-0 in the second quarter while holding the Bulldogs to just 16 total yards in that span. By halftime, the game was effectively out of reach.

Lake Travis quarterback Luke McBride, who misfired on three of his first four attempts, caught fire and never looked back. He closed his night in the third quarter after completing 19 straight passes, tossing touchdowns to Westin Smith (two), Jackson Lueders, and Lark Sidle.

"We hit some short passes, just little 5-yard routes, and that got us into a rhythm," Smith said. "We didn't really connect on deep shots, but the quick game was there all night."

Smith finished with six catches for 79 yards, one of nine Cavaliers to record a reception. Running back Vann Hopping added balance on the ground, rushing for 87 yards and two touchdowns.

By the time the Cavaliers tacked on three more scores in the third quarter, Bowie had no answers left.

Lake Travis coach Hank Carter said there was no panic despite the early hole, though there may have been some fire on the sideline.

"We definitely talked at the quarter," Buck said with a grin. "I'm not going to repeat what we said, but let's just say it worked."
